2005 Federal Energy Act

- EAct 2005 provides more than \$14.5 billion in incentives (both tax credits and tax deductions) to promote domestic energy production and conservation and to expand the use of alternative energy sources such as solar, wind, ethanol, bio-mass and clean-coal technology. To encourage energy efficiency, EAct 2005 includes incentives for:
 - high efficiency commercial buildings
 - high efficiency new homes
 - improvements to existing homes, including high-efficiency furnaces and air conditioners and other equipment
